4	Appointment of Student Trustees On Thursday 9 th November the Union's constituted Appointments Committee held interviews for the vacant student trustee positions. The committee recommends that Helena and Lusungu are appointed as student trustees in accordance with the Union's articles and bye laws.

8.2 Priority Campaign Update: Let's be Honest

The aims of the Let's be Honest campaign are as follows: to educate the ARU community about mental health issues and services available to students; to support the ARU community and proactively address mental health issues through open and accessible support networks; to encourage action by ARU to provide excellent mental health services for all students.

The Let's be Honest report will be officially launched on Wednesday 6th December at Peter Taylor House at 5:30pm.

A promotional campaign will follow the launch of the report including statistics and recommendations. This will be displayed on all campuses. The promotional campaign will include a video to ensure that the report is accessible and visible to all.

Mental health first aid training has been rolled out to committee members, student reps, Union staff and executive officers. There is a £5 deposit, applications are open now and close on 18th December 2017. https://www.angliastudent.com/mhfa/

Monthly de-stress events have been very successful and De-stress Fest will launch in semester two. You're irreplaceable campaign will be integrated into these events through a bracelet campaign.

The Chelmsford Nursing society and Peterborough students requested support with distress events and student engagement.

8.4 Executive Committee Update

Kyia Thompson (Women's Rep) – KT is working on a campaign to raise awareness of sexual violence towards women and is planning a campaign for International Women's Day on 8th March 2018. This includes an academic panel called 'The Talk' to discuss consent and sexual violence. The Siren's Cheerleading society would like to be involved with this campaign.

Stewart Watson (FST Faculty Rep (Cambridge)) – SW ran a Movember campaign which raised £1300 through five fundraising teams, including: AMT society, volleyball, pole society, student staff and other sports clubs. SW has also worked on team based learning module changes within FST and is planning a campaign for the exam period in January.

Leigh Rooney (FSHCE Faculty Rep (Chelmsford))) – LR ran a FSHCE Faculty forum and received extensive feedback from students regarding

mental health, bulling and harassment. This included reports of discrimination whilst on placement. An anonymous survey will created to gather feedback on this issue. This will be circulated to all campuses.

Ben Morris – (FMS Faculty Rep (Chelmsford)) – BM has been working with the FMS Faculty Dean on improvements to paramedic course issues. BM is planning a scenario day from a patient perspective to show the facilities and demonstrations from the students.
