Progress on priority campaign(s)

1. Extra-curricular Activities is being achieved and is still on-going.

I have organised trips to London, Harry Potter Studio, and Fright Night at Thorpe Park etc.

- A. **GIAG trips** has being successful so far with amazing feedback from our student all GIAG trips got responses ranging from 9-infinity out of 10, keeping our record lowest score at 8/10 (On-going project).
- B. **Clubs and Societies Forum** this is a social avenue where clubs and Societies comes together to network and learn how to be effective members from other societies.
